SALVATION ARMY

We have been giving money monthly to the Crossroads Salvation Army since we haven't been able to serve there as we used to do. It is possible now that we could go back to providing food, and/or actually putting the food into the clam-shell meal containers that they are using. We also might be able to load Snack Bags after church sometime. See Survey below.

ATTAIN HOUSING

We have also been giving money for rent assistance each month. We are hoping to do more hands-on projects for this community partner. We can provide activities for the children, adopt the Kensington "pod" of townhouses to maintain, or just the landscape there (which our grounds crew has done before), etc. See Survey below.

LITTLE FOOD PANTRY

These Little Food Pantries (LFP) are to promote food equity without shame. You've probably seen some around, as there are 4 near Crossroads. They are a box on a post with food inside. The sponsors make sure they stay full, including with ethnic food of the folks who live nearby. People can take what they need, and anyone can bring food to refill the LFP. See Survey below.
